III.—Selected Types of Advanced Virtuoso Bowing (Rebounding Spiccato—Up-and-down-Bow Staccato—Spring Bow Arpeggio—Detaché and Spiccato—Mixed Bowing). IV.—Polyphonic Violin Music (Duets for One Violin—Intricate Double Stopping and Chord Playing—Concert Arrangements for One Violin). V.—Harmonics (Single and Double-Stop).
